GRADE II- HUMANITIES








Healthy Sprouts, Healthy Minds – Germination Activity




Grocery Price Research

Decimal Place Value Models




GRADE V-MARATHI

They developed critical 21st-century skills through research, collaboration, and presentations. Sources included news, journals, government reports, WHO, and UNEP data.






GRADE VII-SCIENCE



WORLD PLAY DAY CELEBRATION



Strengthening the Parent-Teen Bond: A Guide for Families

The teenage years are a time of big changes—for both children and parents. Teens are learning who they are, becoming more independent, and forming their own opinions. Parents, on the other hand, are trying to support and guide them through this important stage of life. This often leads to misunderstandings, arguments, and emotional ups and downs. Add in the pressures of school, peer influence, and social media, and it's easy to see why this relationship can feel strained at times.

Common Challenges:

- **Communication Gaps** – Teens feel like they're not being heard, while parents feel ignored or shut out.
- **Privacy vs. Protection** – Teens want space. Parents worry about safety and choices.
- **Academic Pressure** – Expectations around grades and career choices can cause stress on both sides.
- **Mental Health Concerns** – Many teens today struggle with anxiety, stress, or low self-esteem.
- **Screen Time Struggles** – Technology often becomes a point of conflict at home.

Simple Ways to Build a Stronger Connection:

- **Talk and Listen:** Have regular, calm conversations. Show you're listening without jumping to conclusions.
- **Respect Their Voice:** Let your teen express opinions. Give them room to grow and decide. Avoid being judgmental.
- **Set Rules Together:** Involving them in rule-setting builds trust and encourages responsibility.
- **Be a Role Model:** Teens learn more from what you do than what you say.
- **Support Mental Wellness:** Let them know it's okay to not be okay. Be open to getting help if needed.
- **Create Quality Time:** Even 10 minutes a day of genuine connection can make a big difference.
